HEMECRAFT SECTION

Adult Classes

PRESERVES

Jars must be clean, clear glass, no commercial markings, filled to within 1cm of the top. All should have small, plain labels on, stating the main fruit used, day, month and year of making. Labels should be applied neatly in the lower half of the jar. Preserves should be covered with a wax disc, cellophane top and plain screw lid. No fabric covers.

1. Jar of chutney
2. Jar of raspberry jam
3. Jar of strawberry jam
4. Jar of any other jam
5. Jar of fruit jelly
6. Jar of marmalade (not jelly)
7. Jar of lemon curd

BAKING

To be presented on a plain white paper plate;

8. 4 plain scones (from white flour)
9. 4 cheese scones
10. 3 Chocolate Muffins
11. 4 decorated cup cakes

All of the following to be presented on a silver cake board (suitable size for cake)

12. Chocolate Cake (7inch/18cm tin)

Recipe: 6 oz(175g) caster sugar; 6 oz (175g) margarine; 5oz (150g) self raising flour; 3 eggs; 1 oz (25g) cocoa; 3oz (85g) plain chocolate

Method: Melt chocolate in a basin over hot water. Cream together margarine and sugar until light and fluffy. Sieve flour and cocoa. Add eggs to creamed mixture, one at a time with a little flour. Add melted chocolate and then flour. Mix well, but do not beat. Pour mixture into a lined 7" (18cm) round tin. Bake on middle shelf 180°C / 360°F / Gas Mark 4 for approx 45minutes to 1 hour.

13. Victoria sandwich – MEN ONLY made with 3 eggs, jam filled, dredged with caster sugar
14. Victoria sandwich – made with 3 eggs, jam filled, dredged with caster sugar
15. Lemon Drizzle cake

Recipe: 6 oz(175g) caster sugar; 4 oz (110g) margarine; 6oz (175g) self raising flour; 2 eggs; 4 tablespoons milk; 2 lemons.

Method: Cream the margarine and sugar, add the flour (sieved) add the eggs and milk and mix thoroughly. Add the lemon zest (finely grated) and put mixture into a lined loaf tin, 9x5 inches (22 x 12 cm) approx. Bake on middle shelf 160°C / 325°F / Gas Mark 3, until golden brown , approx 45 minutes.

Drizzle: Take 6 tablespoons of icing sugar and juice from 2 lemons, place in a small saucepan stir as you heat gently until clear. Allow cake to cool on a wire rack placed on a tray and pour drizzle over the cake, repeat after a short while by adding the surplus drizzle in the tray.

16. Sultana Cake (deep 7"/18cm tin)

Recipe: 4 oz (110g) butter or margarine; 4 oz (110g) caster sugar, 2 eggs, 8 oz (225g) self raising flour, 3 tbsp milk, vanilla essence, 6oz (175g) sultanas. Set oven to 160-180° C / 350° F / Gas Mark 4

Method: Cream butter and sugar together gradually add lightly whisked eggs. Add essence, fold in flour and add sultanas.

Bake in a moderate oven for about 1hr 15 minutes

GROUP ENTRY SECTION

- 300. ADULTS (16+ on day of show) "Our Group"** – co-operative entries from not less than 3 members of any group.

Collective entry open to any organisation with each item made by a different person.

To be displayed on a base no bigger than 70cm square.

Exhibits to include: 2 different handicrafts, 2 different homecrafts and 1 flower arrangement. 5 items in all to be judged. Drapes and accessories may be used to enhance the exhibits, interpretation and display. Props may also be used.

Height must not exceed 70cm

- 301. CHILDREN (up to 15 years of age on day of show)**

Scarecrow Competition - Scarecrows must be no more than 1m wide x 1.5m high.

Reduce/Reuse/Recycle – wherever possible use recycled/ reused materials. Any new materials used should be able to be reused or recycled.

All scarecrows must be built from scratch by the entrant and any additional information to show how you have created your scarecrow for example photos/descriptions, can be displayed next to your scarecrow for public to see.

The creators name and age should be displayed with the scarecrow (age will be taken into consideration.)

There will be a public vote on the winner of the scarecrow class – judged by the public on the day of the show with the winner announced at 4pm on the day.

Entry Fees: Adult 50p per exhibit / Child 25p per exhibit.

Adult Classes = 16+ on day of show / Child Classes = Up to 15 years old on day of show (Child's age must be on entry forms and clearly labelled on exhibits.)

Tickets to Show: Each entrant to the H&H will receive a £1 discount on their published show entry ticket. This must be purchased in advance through the Chief Steward - see details on the application form.

Rules:

1. All Exhibits to be brought to the Showground, Berry Pomeroy between 8am and 9.30am on Sunday 28th July. Any late arrivals may risk not being entered in to their class/es.
Judging to take place mid-morning.
2. On your arrival at the showground, please report to the H&H team who will be on the main gate to meet you.
 - a) If you are attending the show and hold tickets, the H&H stewards will direct you to the display tent where the team will meet you.
 - b) If you are not attending the event but can get to the showground to drop your entries off, the H&H stewards will meet you at the gate and will escort you to the display tent to place your entries, or alternatively the stewards will be happy to collect your entries from you at the gate and take them to the display tent for you.
 - c) If you are not attending the event and are unable to get to the showground on the Sunday, we may be able to make necessary arrangements to collect your entries from you and get them to the display tent on the day.
3. You will be unable to drive up to the display tent to unload, but we will have already noted if you have a lot of entries and may need help getting them into the showground! H&H team stewards will be on hand to assist you.
4. Any exhibits sent by post must reach the Chief Steward by Monday 22nd July.
5. One entry per person per class
6. All items are entered and exhibited at the owner's risk.
7. Prize Money can be collected from the Homecraft & Handicraft tent between 3.30pm and 4.30pm on the day of the show, Sunday 28th July.
8. Exhibits may be collected between 4pm and 5pm on Sunday 28th July.
9. No exhibits may be removed from the Tent before this time without permission of the Chief Steward. The committee will not be responsible for any exhibit left after 5pm.
10. Prizes are awarded at the Judge's discretion and the Judge's decision must be final. No complaint will be entertained.
