# HORSE CLASSES

**Equine Influenza (EI) vaccination** is a compulsory requirement for all horses attanding the Totnes and District Show. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations are as follows: The first 2 vaccinations 21-92 days apart (but ideally between 4-6 weeks apart), a 3rd booster within 7 months of the 2nd. Annual boosters must be given within 365 days thereafter, but 6-monthly boosters are recommended. No horse should enter a competition venue within 7 days of an EI vaccine. Foals should start vaccination from 5 months of age. Vaccination against tetanus is strongly recommended for all equines.

No horse should enter the showground if showing any signs of infection or disease. We ask all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times: horses will be infectious with certain diseases before they show symptoms.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT.

HOWEVER, RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOWGROUND DURING THE SHOW

All riders must wear protective headgear, according to **current British Safety Standards**. The Totnes Show Society recommends the wearing of protective headgear when leading any horse or pony on the showground and when in the collecting rings.

**Note** - Every section (excluding Retrained Racehorses & Veteran Horses) will have a Championship, where Champion & Reserve Champion rosettes will be awarded.

# General Rules and Regulations for Livestock and Horses

All competitors entries are to be made online or by downloading an entry form from the website. If necessary, paper certificates of entry may be obtained from the Show Manager, PO Box 220, Totnes, Devon, TQ9 9EN and must be correctly filled in and returned before 12 noon on Monday 24th June 2024. Entries will not be accepted after this date. By entering the Show the exhibitor/competitor is agreeing to abide by the shows Rules and Regulations.

- No entry will be accepted unless correctly completed on the prescribed form and accompanied by entrance fee, but see No. 5 of rules for Horses. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Council Departments, BCMS, SAC, Breed Societies and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's veterinary advisors. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.
- 3 No entrance fee shall be refundable on any account including the partial or total abandonment or postponement of the show. All entry fees are published in the schedule.
- In applying for paper certificates of entry, the exhibitor must state the class or classes in which he/she intends to exhibit and the number of entries he/she proposes making stating the name and age of exhibit(s).
- All cattle and sheep must be the bona fide property of the exhibitors and must have been in their possession at least three months before the day of the exhibition. Where applicable entries must comply with the rules of their relevant Breed Societies.
- The committee will not entertain any protest, unless the same is in writing and delivered to the Secretary within one hour of the publication of the judges' decision. Every protest must be accompanied by a deposit of £25 and signed by one exhibitor. The £25 will be forfeited if the committee decides the objection to be frivolous.
- 7 In all cases where prizes are given conditionally they will be withheld until the exhibitor shall have proven to the satisfaction of the committee that the conditions have been complied with.
- 8 Exhibitor's assistants must see that the stock under their care is properly placed.
- 9 The show field will be open for the reception of cattle and sheep from 7am to 8.45am on the morning of the show and none will be admitted after that hour. Horses to be on the ground by 10am. No stock to be removed from the show field until after the Grand Parade has concluded and exhibitors breaking the rule will, in the case of prize winners, forfeit their prizes, and the non-prize winners pay a fine of £25 each respectively. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
- All animals must be shown at the scheduled time and presented without rosettes.
- All horned exhibits must be marked as such on the entry form.
- All cattle to be led into the show field. All bulls over 15 months old to be led into the show field by a clamp or ring in the nose. It is recommended that all bulls are led by a minimum of two attendants. Exhibitors must also provide chains or ropes with all bullocks to fasten them onto cattle lines, as all cattle classes will be judged in the appropriate ring. Exhibitors are requested to make their exhibits halter trained and suitably behaved before the show. The committee cannnot be held responsible for damage caused to or by any exhibits.
- 13 It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that the handler of any animal is of suitable physical capability, experience and age to be in charge of that animal. Junior exhibitors leading animals in the Grand Parade must be accompanied by a competent adult who is NOT handling other animals. Correct dress code must be adhered to at all times.
- 14 It is recommended that ANY stallion or colt, 3 years or over, should wear a bit or chifney at all times when being handled.
- All prize winners taking part in the grand parade must NOT be decorated with rosettes, etc. other than those won at the current Totnes & District Show.
- The committee reserves the right to amalgamate or cancel any class that in their opinion has insufficient entries.
- 17 The judges may withhold any ordinary or special prize where there is an evident want of merit, and where there is only one animal or pen of animals shown in a class, the judges may award the first, second, or third prize according to the merit of the animal or animals exhibited.
- 18 If at any time whatever during the show the judges shall have the cause to doubt the soundness of a horse, notwithstanding the same may be provided with a certificate, they shall order such horse to be examined by the Society's veterinary surgeon, whose decision shall be final.

- All riders must wear protective headgear which complies with the relevant current British Standard. The Totnes Show Society recommends the wearing of protective headgear when leading any horse or pony on the showground.
- While the Officials take every care, the Society will not in any case or under any circumstances be responsible for any accident, loss, damage, or injury to the competitors or the public attending the show, or for stock or produce which may be exhibited at the show. All exhibitors and competitors must hold a minimum of £5m public liability insurance which is to be valid on the day of the show.
- 21 It is the responsibility of Exhibitors erecting their own gazebos on site to ensure they are anchored and secured, posing no risk.
- Any person entering an animal or animals in the wrong class will be disqualified.
- No person shall enter the judging area or have communication with the judges or examining veterinary surgeon without permission from the steward.
- A full description as to name, colour, marks, etc. must be stated for every horse entered.
- Prize winners in the Cattle and Supreme Champion and Breed Champions in the Horse Sections must take part in the Grand Parade. Failure to do so may mean forfeiture of prize money. Prize Winners are asked to collect their prize money before 4:00pm on the Show day, from the ticket booth at the pedestrian entrance gate in the main Show field. Failure to do so entitles the Show to retain the prize money forthwith. No prize money will be posted after the Show.
- Any exhibitor not responding to the request to return the cup(s) and/or trophy on time will not be entitled to take away any cups that they win in the future.
- 27 Rosettes will be awarded as follows: Cattle and Sheep to third place. Horses to sixth place. A 4th place in the sheep classes will be awarded, only if 10 or more entries are forward in a class on the Show day.
- Mobile phones must not be used when handling any livestock or equine in the Grand Parade or in any area of the Showground.
- 29 Quad Bikes or mini motorbikes are not permitted in any area of the showground, car or lorry park, other than those authorised and used by Show Officials
- Tampering with animals: Any artificial contrivance or device of any description found on or proved to have been used on an animal at any time whilst that animal is in the Showground, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purpose, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize, and any prize awarded prior to discovery will be forfeited. The Instigator or The Owner of the said animal may be prohibited from again entering Stock for any of the Committee's Shows, for such period as the Committee may see fit. For the purpose of this Regulation, the term 'improper practice' shall be held to include setting of teats, and generally any other practice including tampering or of their own or any other animal by the exhibitor or any other person which results in the animals being shown other than in a natural state, and the Committe reserves the right to have all animals inspected by the Committee's Veterinary Officers, either prior to, during, or after judging.

The Committee will not tolerate the administration to show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question to have the effect of making it behave in the show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Committee reserves the right to take any necessary samples. Any Person or Exhibitor (or his representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquilliser or drugs to any Show exhibit will be reported to the Organising Committee, and dealt with at their discretion. In addition the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

Any Exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection, having reference to Livestock exhibited at this Show, must make the same in accordance with the objection requirements of the Committee. If, on investigation, the objection is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Committee, the sum thus deposited shall, at the discretion of the Committee, be forfeited to the funds of the Society. All objections must be lodged on the same day as the alleged incident occurred in accordance with the objection regulations, and no objection will be SUBSEQUENTLY received, unless a reason, satisfactory to the Committee be assigned for the delay

Biosecurity measures in place will be strictly adhered to. Livestock vehicles must arrive having been cleaned and disinfected before leaving the holding. The show reserves the right to turn away any vehicle which they (in partnership with the veterinary expertise on site) feel is not in a clean state and has the potential for the spread of infection.

# **Special Rules and Regulations applying to Horse Section**

- All entries to classes in which height restriction apply must be measured by the official measurer before entering the collecting ring, measuring will take place at the entrance to the collecting ring. Half an inch will be allowed for shoes and the official measurer's decision will be final. Joint measurement scheme certificates will be accepted in all classes.
- 2 Any rider in classes subject to restrictions as to age may be required to produce their birth certificate. The age of the rider will be as of - eg 1st January 2024
- 3 Suitably Mounted All animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry park, must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.
- 4 Competitors wearing an incorrect number, or more than one number, in the judging ring are liable to disqualification.
- 5 Rosettes may not be worn in the ring whilst judging is in progress.
- The committee wish to make it known that entries close, 12 noon on 24th June 2024. The Show Manager has been given instructions that No 2 of the general rules must be rigidly adhered to and no entries are to be accepted for any classes, under any circumstances, unless accompanied by the requisite entry fee or fees.
- 7 The attention of competitors and exhibitors is drawn to the general rules for the Show, especially Rule 26.
- 8 Entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 9 No nomination entries will be accepted.
- Horse exhibitors are not allowed to ride or lead horses in the Show Fields, except those going to or from the Judging Rings, but must use the exercise area provided. The committee reserves the right to order any horse, rider etc. from the Show Ground to the exercise area.
- Exhibitors entering more than one class must, if class times clash, decide which class they wish to attend
- 12 All Champion and Reserve Champions in the horse sections must stay and take part in the Supreme Horse Championship in the main ring.
- 13 All Riders must wear protective headgear, according to the **Current British Standards**.
  - The Totnes Show Society recommends the wearing of protective headgear when leading any horse or pony on the showground and when in the collecting rings.
- 12 The Judges decision is final.
